Fort Cumberland was an 18th century fort in what is now Cumberland, Maryland at the confluence of Wills Creek and the Potomac River. It featured prominently during the French and Indian War, and was a major staging ground for General Braddock's disastrous campaign to Fort Duquesne in 1755.

Trees that Speak by Robert Griffing

In this painting, Robert Griffing illustrates how the Woodland Indians used "painted trees" to leave messages for friends, family and foe alike. This was accomplished by peeling the bark and painting with red ochre and charcoal, universally understood symbols.

The technique was used to boast about the success of a hunt or war party, spread the recent news, tell stories, give warning or convey a message to those who followed the Indian paths. The paintings were very durable and could remain visible for as long as fifty years.

Compassion bronze sculpture by Steven Lalioff

Indiana sculptor Steven Lalioff has created this bronze sculpture, based on a wood carving believed to have been made by an Ottawa carver for a Jesuit mission sometime before 1840. Steve's sculpture is made of bronze and includes iron, red sealing wax and sharpened slivers of moose antler to form the crown of thorns, exaggerated in size by the artist to incorporate a duel symbolism of a halo. Ambush at Lovewell pond, 1725 by John Buxton



This painting by John Buxton depicts the calm before the storm of an American Indian surprise attack on militiamen. Captain John Lovewell of New England, a ranger and renowned scalp hunter, died on May 8, 1725 as he led a third expedition against the Abenaki Indians in an area now known as Fryeburg, Maine. A number of colonial militiamen and Abenaki Native Americans, including a notorious war chief named Paugus, also died in the engagement which marked the end of hostilities between the Abenaki and the white colonists in this part of the colonies.

More than 100 years later, the event was immortalized in the poem by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, *The Battle of Lovewell's Pond*.

WHITE MAN FIRE STICKS BY HOWARD TERPNING[®]

"The Native people were awestruck when they first saw firearms carried by the white man and how destructive they were," Terpning says. "The early muskets were smooth bore flintlocks and, for their time, were very effective although such a weapon took time to re-load as opposed to the use of the bow and arrows. To the first Americans, they seemed to be sticks that shot fire out of one end. These two Blackfoot warriors are engaged in a small skirmish with their enemy, possibly the Flatheads. This area is near the Swan River in the Flathead Valley of Montana."

The Siege of Fort William Henry: A Year on the Northeastern Frontier by Ben Hughes

Fort William Henry on the southern shore of New York's Lake George was a key fortification supporting British interests along the frontier with

French America. French Commander Louis-Joseph de Montcalm and his American Indian allies laid siege to Fort William Henry headed by Lieutenant Colonel George Monro, in 1757, which led Monro to eventually surrender. As part of the terms, the British regiment, colonial militia, and their camp followers would be allowed safe passage to nearby Fort Edward. The French watched in horror, however, as their Indian allies attacked the British column after it left the fort, an episode that sparked outrage and changed the tactics of the war.

Seen through the eyes of participants such as Louis Antoine de Bougainville, a scholarly young aide-decamp, Jabez Fitch, an amiable Connecticut sergeant, and Kisensik, a proud Nipissing chief, The Siege of Fort William Henry: A Year on the Northeastern Frontier uses contemporary newspaper reports, official documents, private letters, and published memoirs to bring the narrative to life.

Insignia of Independence: Military Buttons, Accoutrement Plates & Gorgets of the American Revo*lution* by Don Troiani and Iames L. Kochan

Author Mike O'Donnell describes this book best by

writing, "Following decades of intense research, this is the final word on buttons, plates and insignia of the American Revolution. The two most qualified experts in the realm of Revolutionary War militaria have joined forces to present the collecting community with this fabulous opus. Years in the making, it will not be surpassed: the finished product has proven greater than its parts. A delight to behold, its illustrations are exquisite, the design is engaging and it has been organized in a logical manner while avoiding the temptation to over-write.

Year of the Hangman: George Washington's Campaign Against the Iroquois by Glenn F. Williams

Turning its attention to the colonial frontiers, especially those of western New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia,

Britain enlisted its provincial rangers, Tories, and allied warriors, principally from the Iroquois Confederacy, to wage a brutal backwoods war in support of General John Burgoyne's offensive as it swept southward from Canada in an attempt to cut the colonies in half, divert the Continental Army, and weaken its presence around British-occupied New York City and Philadelphia.

Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga sent shock waves through the British command. But the efforts along the frontier under the direction of Sir John Johnson, Colonel John Butler, and Joseph Brant, appeared to be impairing the American ability to conduct the war. Destroying Patriot settlements and farms across hundreds of miles of frontier, the British and Indian forces threatened to reduce Continental army enlistment, and more importantly, precious food supplies. Following the massacres at the colonial settlements of Wyoming, Pennsylvania, and Cherry Valley, New York, the Continental Congress persuaded General George Washington to conduct a decisive offensive to end the threat once and for all. Brewing for years, the conflict between the Iroquois and colonists would now reach its deadly climax.

Pennsylvania "Horns of the Trade": Screwtip Powder Horns and Their <u>Architecture</u> by Arthur J. DeCamp

As described on the CLA blog, this book is a joint

effort by Art DeCamp and the Kentucky **Rifle Association** (KRA) which will become a "go to" source for information and detailed photographs of Screw-tip



powder horns. Noted authority Art DeCamp tells the story in text and pictures of the development and manufacture of Screw-tip horns in PA.

The book begins with an overall map that shows the counties in PA where the Screw-tip horns were made. Then, each chapter throughout the book starts with a map of that county. The horns are shown with a close up of the tip and butt then a full shot of the horn. Over 300 pages of history and county by



county documentation are presented in full color for the beginner, modern day screw-tip horn maker, as well as the experienced collector.

Border Fights and Fighters Volume 1: Stories of the Frontier between the Alleghenies and the Ohio River Valley by Cyrus Townsend Brady.

This new paperback book, Volume 1, is a reprint of four chapters from an original book published in 1901, written by the great grandnephew of Captain Samuel Brady. His writing, spelling and style is of a century ago, but it is easy to read and comprehend the very accurate details.

The four exciting chapters in this volume includes Henry Bouquet and follows his march over the PA mountains westward to his decisive and victorious battle at Bushy Run. Then you'll meet Captain Samuel Brady, Chief of the Rangers, detailing this great family of fighters, the famous Brady leap and Captain Sam Brady's adventures on the

frontier with the likes of Lewis Wetzel and other Indian fighters. The third chapter is about General Andrew Lewis and the Battle of Point Pleasant. Lord Dunmore's War was precipitated by the murder of Chief Logan's family and Lewis fights a pivotal battle between Shawnee Chief Cornstalk and a collection of border fighters with names like Girty and Kenton. The final chapter details George Rogers Clark's terrible 10 day winter march through ice and water up to their waists to capture the British "Hair Buyer General" at the Battle of Vincennes; saving The Great Northwest Territory and the USA from having a second Revolutionary War front being opened on our Western border. Factual and interesting, these are stories of bravery and leadership so that a free country would emerge from a frontier of chaos.
